



Fall 2021 Work-Based Learning Experience

Humanim's Work-Based Learning Experience (WBLE) program is a 4–8 week internship and employer mentoring program that introduces high school-aged students with a disability to employment. Students engage in workplace readiness training on site with an assigned employer to receive hands-on career exploration in different occupations, while gaining transferable skills for future employment. Weekly hours will be discussed on a case by case scenario.

Program Details

Program is offered in the following regions:

Anne Arundel County | Baltimore City | Baltimore County | Howard County | Harford County

Program schedule varies per region and will be conducted from October – December 2021

Eligibility:

- ▶ Must have an active/open case with DORS
- ▶ Must be open to career exploration at various work sites, to include healthcare facilities
- ▶ Must be able to participate in a one day onboarding career readiness training
- ▶ Must be able to follow employer COVID 19 protocol which may include a TB Shot, mask, and/or COVID 19 vaccination prior to program start
- ▶ Must have transportation to and from employer volunteer sites

BENEFITS TO STUDENTS

Work-Based Learning Experience is a great way for students to explore career options in a supportive environment. Youth will work on site with employers to gain concrete work skills and experience, as well as personal confidence and the opportunity to network with potential employers. A stipend will be provided.

BENEFITS TO EMPLOYERS

Work-Based Learning Experience allows students to gain valuable work experience in exchange for volunteering. Youth will receive on the job skills to support transition into the workplace. Employers have the opportunity to establish workplace expectations and a rapport with potential new hires, resulting in a better prepared talent pool.
