PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Humanim's Student Career Choices program utilizes both a classroom and contextual training model to equip high school students who possess a wide range of disabilities and learning styles, with the skills, knowledge, and experience necessary to prepare for competitive, integrated employment. This program is offered in partnership with Humanim's Pre-Employment Transition Services, and will allow students to exit high school with transferable skills such as identifying interest, pinpointing potential job, self-advocate & understanding appropriate work behavior.

Eligibility

- ▶ Certificate track student
- ▶ Referral from the Division of Rehabilitation Services (DORS) from high school transition counselor
- ▶ Parents must discuss with a DORS counselor to verify student eligibility for Student Career Choices (SCC)
- ▶ Students must show interest in career building and internships
- ▶ Families must complete an intake and interview process BEFORE starting program
- ▶ Students must maintain a strong record of conduct, including attendance, behavior, and participation in all activities, to succeed in the completion of the program and have offer of summer internships
