Scott has overseen the development of numerous grant-funded and fee-for-service programs, and he has extensive experience delivering crisis and support services to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. For 27 years, Scott has served as Humanim's principal liaison to the Developmental Disabilities Administration's Central Maryland Regional Office, coordinating crisis evaluations and managing priority Behavioral Support Services cases across the region.

In 2021, Scott assumed leadership of Humanim's Meaningful Day/Developmental Disabilities Programs, including the Behavioral Stabilization Unit (BSU). The BSU serves behaviorally complex adults aged 21 and older with developmental disabilities, including those with Autism, intellectual disabilities, mental health conditions, and traumatic brain injuries. A passionate advocate for individuals with I/DD, Scott has participated in numerous statewide committees and has presented on applied behavioral analysis.
